CHAPTER I

INTRODUCTION

A. Background of the Research

In modern literature work, having a hero as a main character has become more popular than before. As one of the archetype approaches, the hero's journey is used by many literary works creators to show their character development to their readers. Everyone can be a hero but usually, the main character is the one who always gets the hero title. Being a hero is not just having the title and getting acknowledged by everyone, but there are numerous journeys the hero must go through before being called a hero. In their research, Lestari (2021) explains that a protagonist character in fiction is typically referred to as a hero. It describes a character who tries and encounters obstacles to get a different course in life.

As stated by Vogler (2007, p. 29), a hero is someone who is prepared to forego his wants to meet the needs of others, much like a shepherd who makes sacrifices to care for and serve his flock. The concept of a hero is fundamentally tied to selflessness. A hero must leave behind his familiar environment and embark on a journey into a new one that will test him. The hero must accept responsibility for these obstacles and overcome them. Once the challenge is completed, the hero must go back to his usual environment.

A character's journey from the moment he is called away from his normal life to complete certain assignments to returning home as a hero is mostly outlined in the hero's Journey. According to Vogler (2007, p. 7) not just stories with "heroic" physical action and adventure can follow the stages of the hero's journey. Every story's protagonist is a hero's journey, even if that path just takes him within his own head or into the world of relationships. Every great story has a hero who develops and journeys from one state of being to another, such as from hate to love, from weakness to strength, from hopelessness to strength, and so on. These meaningful journeys are what captivate audiences and give a story its engaging quality.

There are three acts as stated by Vogler, where the first act is separation. In this act, there are five phases where the hero starts his journey from the ordinary world where they have a normal life into the extraordinary world where they get a call to begin their adventure as a hero. In this act also where the hero refuses the call of their journey at first but then accepts it after meeting with their mentor. After that, the hero will cross the threshold. The second act is called initiation. There are four phases in this act, where the hero will meet their tests, allies, and enemies. Then, the hero will prepare to face their life-death situations. The last act is return. There are three phases In this act, the hero goes back from the special world after going through a lot of troubles. The hero may go back with a reward or even nothing.

Hero's journey is one of the archetype approaches. Where Every individual is composed of an archetype, Jung (as cited in Vogler; 2007, p. 23) used the term archetypes, which refers to enduring psychological patterns that are inherited by all members of the human race. Jung suggested that the collective unconscious may be similar to the personal unconscious. For example, fairy tales and myths are like the dreams of an entire culture, springing from the collective unconscious.

The idea of archetypes is a vital resource for comprehending the role or objective of characters in a narrative. In both the personal and social spheres, similar character types appear to be prevalent. Comprehending the role of the archetype embodied by a certain character can aid in assessing whether or not the character is contributing fully to the narrative.

The Maze Runner is a dystopian book written by American writer James Dashner. According to Chicken House Books (https://www.chickenhouse books.com) the novel won a lot of awards including the Best Fiction award for Young Adult Awards in 2011 and Young Reader's Choice Award in 2012. The novel got more popular that it was adapted into a movie and won a lot of awards also including the MTV Movie & TV Award in 2015. The Maze Runner contains three books that tell about Thomas's journey from escaping a maze to saving the world. The first book was released in 2009, it was the beginning part where the story takes place on a planet where civilians are fighting to survive a catastrophic disease known

as the Flare in the wake of a coronal mass ejection. The 16-year-old protagonist of the story, Thomas, is the key to his friends' redemption and awakens in an artificially created maze with no memory of his past. The story continues to the second book which it released in 2010 with title The Maze Runner: The Scorch Trial, this book tells about when Thomas and his other friend succeed in escaping the maze, but little do they know that the whole world already collapsed because of the deadly virus. Then the trilogy ends with the title The Maze Runner: The Death Cure released in 2011. This book shows where Thomas and the other continue their journey to find the cure after they escape the WICKED territory where they monopolize Thomas and the other to be a human experiment. The Writer decides to choose all three books because they tell Thomas's hero's journey which follows the key stages of Vogler's theories.

Up until now, character is still one of the important aspects in the work of literature making. The character is critical in literature and is usually used to represent the work itself. Furthermore, heroes were used as representations. As time passed, many literature works creators used hero-themed for their stories. They are common in fantasy and adventure literary works. 1. Novel

2. Trilogy

A trilogy or set of three plays, novels, operas, etc. that are closely related in theme, order, or other aspects even though they are each completed on their own.

3. Hero

A person who is viewed as an ideal or role model by others due to their perceived unique accomplishments, skills, or personal traits.

4. Hero's Journey

The hero's journey is a popular narrative paradigm, or story template, in which the hero embarks on an adventure, gains wisdom from the

experience, uses that wisdom to achieve a victory, and then transforms back to his home place.
