CHAPTER V

CONCLUSION AND SUGGESTION

In this chapter, the researcher came to conclusions of the data as the results and summary. Suggestions then are written as the closure for this research.

A. Conclusion

A Man Called Otto is a 2022 American comedy-drama film directed by Marc Forster from a screenplay by David Magee which became the object data and would be analysed through maxim point of view. The flouting maxim committed by the main characters in the movie have a total of 30 data. Based on the results of data analysis and discussion, the author obtained conclusions that can be drawn from research regarding the analysis of flouting maxim on the main characters in *A man called Otto movie*, which are as follows:

- 1. The results of this research show that the 15 or 50% data on flouting maxim in conversational dialogue carried out by the main characters in the film A Man Called Otto were mostly flouting maxim quantity, most of which were carried out by Otto, while the rest were carried out by the other main characters. Otto in the movie is depicted as a slightly rude and annoying person but very rule-abiding.
- 2. The remaining flouting were committed by other actors, namely 1 or 3,33% data flouting of maxim quality, 8 or 26,67% data relevance.
- 3. The last 6 or 20% data maxim manner flouting of maxim manner is a that is also often committed by the main characters.

- 4. The total number of flouting maxims committed by the main characters in the *movie A Man Called Otto* is 30 data or if calculated as a whole based on the percentage of data, it is 100% of the maxim quantity, maxim quality, maxim relevance and maxim of manner.
- 5. The most frequent flouting maxim strategies used by the main characters are understatement and overstatement. The least frequent flouting maxim strategies used are sarcasm and banter.

B. Suggestion

The researcher has several suggestions to provide as the analysis has come to conclusions. The suggestions provided will be of use to any future readers and researcher herself. The suggestions are as put below:

1. For the researcher

- a. Researchers must have better and correct conversations as speakers and listeners with other people directly or on social media based on information received verbally or in writing, especially if it is related to negative news, such as opinions about other people or spreading information because all depends on the sentences we say and is closely related to society.
- b. Because researchers know that this research paper can still be improved, researchers can use this paper for further research on flouting, both for qualitative, quantitative, comparative and other research. The author hopes that future researchers can create something more useful, such as creating a book about maxim violations that are rarely discussed by other people.

2. For readers

- a. The researcher hopes this paper can help future readers to understand flouting maxim and to take examples of this paper's writing and analysis to help them achieve a better and more elaborate also comprehensive study.
- b. The researcher hopes future readers can use this paper as a reference for their study and research even if it is unrelated to their research.

3. For society

- a. The researcher hopes this research can make society realize the importance of flouting maxim and how it affects any individual from any group. Flouting of maxims can occur in everyday life and it can cause fatal errors if not corrected. Therefore, it is important for people to know the science that studies flouting maxim.
- b. Through this analysis, the author hopes that the public can be more aware of the importance of following the principles of good and correct communication, as explained by Grice's theory. In addition, this study also shows how characters like Otto, who often flouting maxims because of their rule-loving and often angry nature, can create miscommunication. By understanding these characteristics and communication patterns, people can learn to be more sensitive and adaptive in interacting with others, thereby reducing the potential for conflict and improving the quality of communication.
