CHAPTER V

CONCLUSION AND SUGGESTION

This chapter will concentrate on conclusions based on the data analysis conducted in the previous chapter and will make recommendations to various those who matter. This chapter has two primary sections: conclusion and suggestion. The conclusion section summarizes the findings and discussions linked to the questions of the research, while the suggestion section makes recommendations to the readers and other writers.

A. Conclusion

This research concludes by analyzing the question of the research related to types of communication disorders and causes of communication disorders in the documentary movie Gabby Giffords Won't Back Down. This movie lasted for an hour and a half and consisted of 30 data that included types of communication disorders and causes of communication disorders.

- 1. In types of communication disorders, the writer found 16 types of language disorders which are 4 data in disorder of form (13.33%), 10 data in disorder of content (33.33%), and 2 data in disorder of use (6.67%). While in speech disorders, the writer found 14 types which are 1 datum in the disorder of articulation (3.33%) and 13 data in the disorder of fluency (43.33%).
- 2. Related to the types of communication disorders, a disorder of form is usually characterized by the inability to use the correct grammatical structure. The second type is disorder of content is characterized by the

inability to correctly name an object because this disorder of content is related to the use of semantics functions or the meaning of a word. Furthermore, the third type is a disorder of use is characterized by an inability to answer questions that are by the context of the conversation. Fourth, a disorder of articulation is characterized by the inability to articulate a word correctly. The last type found is a disorder of fluency tends to have the characteristics of stuttering, difficulty in uttering words and also the use of pause fillers in utterances.

- The writer also found 30 causes of communication disorders which are 22 data caused by Broca's aphasia (73.33%), 4 data caused by anomic aphasia (13.33%), and 4 data caused by Wernicke's aphasia (13.33%).
- 4. Related to the causes of communication disorders, Broca's aphasia causes problems in speech, where understanding of the language wants to convey is good but has difficulty in speaking the language. Meanwhile, anomic aphasia causes impaired naming of objects which makes it difficult to name an object correctly. Apart from that, Wernicke's aphasia causes problems in understanding the language received and causes difficulty in answering questions according to the context of the question.

B. Suggestion

1. Readers

Readers will have a deeper understanding of the many communication disorders caused by aphasia. These research's findings may serve as an inspiration for future research and advances. This understanding increases the relevance of the research for various readers. By taking these suggestions seriously, readers will gain a better understanding of research on communication disorders especially those caused by aphasia.

2. Other Writers

The writer hoped that other writers who research communication disorders due to aphasia could carry out further research on other types of communication disorders. This is because many types of communication disorders almost have the same characteristics. Apart from that, other writers are also expected to be able to research more deeply into the types of aphasia to provide a more detailed understanding of each type of communication disorder. Other writers can also compare other theories from experts using the same method to produce another research.
