

CHAPTER V

CONCLUSION AND SUGGESTION

A. Conclusion

This study focused on analysis of questions and responses in cross-examination in *Primal Fear* Movie. The data analysis is on the whole data research findings. It was aimed to find out the type and function of questions from lawyers, responses from witness or accused and the correlation between the questions and answers. The results from this study based on support data and published have the following conclusions:

1. There are 5 types of questions in 30 data found from the lawyers in the *Primal Fear*. *Declaratives* employed with 8 occurrences. *Tag Questions* with 4 occurrences. *Polar Yes-No Question* with 12 occurrences. *Wh-Questions* with 4 occurrences. *Projection Questions* with 2 occurrences.
2. There are four functions of the questions found from the witness or accused in the *Primal Fear* Movie. Those are *Confirmation*, *Agreement*, *Supply Truth Value*, *Call for Elaboration*.
3. As the result there are four Maxims namely Cooperative on Maxim of Quality, Violation on Maxim of Quantity, Violation on Maxim of Relation and Violation on Maxim of Manner. *Cooperative on Maxim of Quality* that describes message must be truthful and does not lack suitable evidence, consist of 14 occurrences. *Violation on Maxim of*

Quantity that describes that speaker fails to deliver informative message as what is required and does not more or less than it, *consist of 6 occurrences*. *Violation on Maxim of Relation* that describes speaker fails to be relevant in the talk exchange, *consist of 3 occurrences*. *Violation on Maxim of Manner* that describes speaker fails to convey clear message, *consist of 7 occurrences*.

4. The analysis points to the conclusion that the correlation between the questions from lawyers and responses from witnesses and accused, out of 30 questions, *Cooperative on Maxim* occurred 14 times, meanwhile *Violation on Maxim* occurred 16 times.

B. Suggestion

Based on the conclusion stated above, this writer has some suggestions to the readers as provided in the following items.

1. To other researchers, it is suggested that this study could be further expanded in examining the court proceedings in different legal case with the other approach. Further improvements are expected to result an improved understanding of forensic linguistic in legal proceedings area.
2. To the readers, it is suggested to use this study as reference to consent for understanding the application of Forensic Linguistic to language-related real-life problems, especially legal proceedings.

3. To the writer, As the writer hopes that this research can be useful for the readers in terms of as a related reference in analyzing works of forensic linguistics, the writer is delightful if there are some advices or critics regarding this research to make this research better.
