CHAPTER V

CONCLUSION AND SUGGESTION

A. Conclusion

After analyzing finite and non-finite verbs in political news of "*The Jakarta Post*" newspaper, the writer has summarized some conclusions based on the data study as follows:

- 1. In its classifications, finite verbs are ones that have subjects and indicate tenses (present and past), while non-finite verbs by contrast are ones that do not have tenses or subjects that they correspond to.
- In classifying and differentiating verbs between finite and non-finite verbs, the most fundamental thing to be focused on is tense.
- 3. There are various finite and non-finite verbs found in political news of "*The Jakarta Post*" newspaper which were taken and collected from two articles published on Monday, January 27th, 2020 and Tuesday, January 28th, 2020, with the focus on news related to "Donald Trump's issues between Israeli and Palestinians", they are 128 data of finite verbs and 144 data of non-finite verbs. The data of non-finite verbs themselves are divided into 31 –*to* infinitives, 26 bare infinitives, 23 passive participles, 30 –*ing* participles, 12 passive participle forms of *be*, 9 progressive participle forms of *be*, and 13 perfect participle forms of *have*.

- 4. In the same articles of political news found in "*The Jakarta Post*" newspaper, the form of non-finite verbs which mostly exist is *-to* infinitive.
- 5. From total of 20 data written in the Chapter IV, there are 3 simple sentences, 13 complex sentences, and 4 compound-complex sentences found in the articles.

B. Suggestion

After drawing some conclusions of this research, the writer would love to give some suggestions as follows:

1. The Readers

This research is intended to captivate the attention of public audiences so that all readers with different gender, age, occupation, interest, educational background, and social status will be attracted to learn English eagerly. Furthermore, with the completion of the research, the writer suggested the readers to read and learn this research thoroughly in order that the readers have new and abundant insights about English Syntax, especially about finite and non-finite verbs.

2. The English Learner

The writer hopes that this research will be able to provide a further and abundant information about English syntax, especially finite and nonfinite verbs, so that the learners' knowledges about them could be widened and increased as well. Not only increasing their knowledges about finite and non-finite verbs, the writer also hopes that this research will be able to give valuable insights about tenses, verbs, and grammatically-made sentences. In addition, after the learners read this paper thoroughly, the writer advised the learners to apply these knowledges to their writing skills, thus a proper and grammatically sentence could be made correctly from now on, or in other words, their writing skills would be more advanced than before.
