

CHAPTER V

CONCLUSION AND SUGGESTION

A. Conclusion

After analyzing those data, it has been concluded that there is an interaction between morphology and phonology in allomorph creation which called phonologically conditioned. This classification is formed by using the theory from Katamba. It can be concluded that:

1. Kind of inflectional suffixes that create allomorphs in regular verb and plural noun can be found in the short story “Flower Garden” by T. Albert. All of the allomorphs which found in the short story are mostly in regular verb. It can be seen that classification kinds of inflectional suffixes that create allomorphs, they are: regular verbs found about 23 (57,5%) allomorphs, and plural noun found about 17 (42,5%) allomorphs.
2. There is an interaction between Morphology and Phonology in allomorph creation. Each kinds of allomorph can be analyzed special approach which known as phonologically conditioned. Inflectional suffixes have several allomorphs, which occur in the past tense of regular verbs in English which is spelled *-ed* is realized in speech by /ɪd/, /d/, or /t/, or in plural noun which is spelled *-s* is realized speech by /ɪz/, /z/, or /s/. The choice of allomorph used in a given context is normally phonologically conditioned.

B. Suggestion

In this research, the writer made much lack in both the theory and analysis, but the writer hopes this research can help the readers to know more about Morphology especially in inflectional suffixes that create allomorph.

1. The readers are suggested to understand the elements of Linguistics sequentially.
