

CHAPTER V

CONCLUSION AND SUGGESTION

A. Conclusion

Troy is a film that produced by Warner Bros Studio in 2004. It is an epos or epic film that tells story about a Greek legendary warrior, Achilles, in ancient Greece story of Troy conquest. It is directed by Wolfgang Petersen and David Benioff. The writer found 21 data that described and analyzed Achilles as the protagonist who is called as a fiercest Greek warrior. Based on data analysis, the writer concluded as following:

1. The writer found that Achilles is a masculine man. As the main character in *Troy* film, Achilles has complete attributes of a man. Those are physical, sexual, emotional, intellectual, interpersonal, personal, and functional traits. Although, in the emotional aspect, Achilles is not like a man stereotype in general, because he expresses his deep regret by crying. This is very natural because crying is the common expression of human, regardless of gender. All of his masculinity traits are constructed by his social life in his surroundings. In this context, Achilles's masculinity is shaped from his experiences including fighting in wars, facing unwise king, meeting with Briseis,

and losing someone he loved. All of his masculinity traits are represented through his physical feature, action and words.

Leading the Myrmidon army and facing all the problems, such as unmatched enemy and great responsibility, are the characteristics of a leader which lead him to the goals.
