

CHAPTER V

CONCLUSIONS AND SUGGESTION

A. Conclusion

After analyzing the data in the previous chapter, it can be concluded that there is a phoneme /l/ consisting of clear, dark, and de-voiced found in songs by Celine Dion in the album "Falling into you". Conclusions answering two research questions can be listed as follows:

1. In Celine Dion's songs there are thirty-five words containing phoneme /l/ clear, dark and de-voiced randomly. The Clear /l/ consist fifteen data in the percentage 43%, and the second dark /l/ consist eleven data in the percentage 31%. Then, de-voiced /l/ consist nine data in the percentage 26%.
2. Classify the phoneme /l/ contained in Celine Dion's songs into three classifications, namely clear, dark, and de-voiced. Examples for clear type are like /lʌk/ and believe /bɪ'li:v/ (clear type that makes /l/ clear pronunciation because of its place in the word or environment), cold: /kəʊld/ and cruel: /'kru:(ə)l/ for dark type (the type that makes the /l/ ark or shadow pronounced because of the place in the word or environment) Examples for devoiced (phonemes that start with voiceless p/t/k , do not cause vibration, are influenced by the word and the environment) pleasure /'pleʒə/ and allow /ə'laʊ/.

B. Suggestion

After analyzing and giving conclusions about the style, voice and syllable phoneme /l/ in Celine Dion songs, the writer would like to provide suggestions for this research, so that it can be useful for everyone. Here it is:

1. For other writers

The results of this study can provide more information about clear, dark, and de-voiced /l/ in phonology and contribute something valuable for everyone who wants to learn English. Especially English literature and helps them understand clear, dark and de-voiced /l/.

2. For readers

Studying and reading the main book can sometimes be tedious. This research studies phonology, especially the phoneme /l/ invites readers to know and practice good English pronunciation. The reader must know the object because the writer uses famous songs from famous singers. This research is quite difficult and easy to understand at the same time. The readers can understand and use this research from time to time.
