

CHAPTER V

CONCLUSION AND SUGGESTION

After analysing the data completely, this chapter contains two different sections, conclusion and suggestion. As a conclusion, some points are made from the results based on the objectives of this research. In suggestions, some suggestions are allowed to some parties referred to the results.

A. Conclusions

Based on the findings and discussion, several conclusions can be formulated as follows:

1. Regarding the objective of this research, namely identifying the type and syntactic structure of ditransitive verbs in 13 short stories by Lucy Maud Montgomery, it was found that 6 out of 7 types of ditransitive verbs are verbs that inherently signify acts of giving, verbs of sending, verbs of instantaneous causation, of ballistic motion (Verbs of throwing), verbs of continuous causation of accompanied motion in deictically, verbs of future having, and verbs of type of communicated message. While one other type that was not found was verbs of instrument of communication. The most common types of ditransitive verbs found are verbs of future having with the frequency of occurrence 7 times out of a total of 25 findings. The lowest frequency is obtained by verbs of sending with only 1 datum.
2. The second objective of this research is to describe the syntactic structure of ditransitive verb sentences using tree diagrams in 13 selected short stories by Lucy Maud Montgomery. With that, the placement of each

object of the sentence can be known along with the role in each word. Like the dative construction, the indirect object is placed right after the verb. Further, if the prepositional construction, then the location of the indirect object is marked with a preposition. Meanwhile, if the passive construction, the location of the indirect object can be marked with a preposition that is located after the verb. Furthermore, if it is in the form of an infinitive construction with a non-finite clause as the second complement, the indirect object is located after the verb in the main clause.

B. Suggestions

Based on the research results that have been obtained, several suggestions are put forward for further research. These suggestions are presented as follows:

1. For English students and other researchers

The use of ditransitive verbs is an interesting topic to study. The writer suggests to further researchers to develop this research because this topic is still considered rare to be analyzed in final projects like this.

2. For the readers

Readers must understand the syntax first. Then, understand about ditransitive verbs and how the sentence structure of ditransitive verbs. Through the results of this research, the writer hopes that readers can become more familiar with not only transitive and intransitive verbs but also about ditransitive verbs. This research also aims to provide readers

with additional insight that a sentence can have more than one object which is called an indirect object.

3. For the Department of Literature and Campus

Lecturers have to know and understand about student research as a reference and inform new students about the research. The writer also hopes that this paper can be useful for students and readers in terms of analyzing ditransitive verbs in sentences. It is also hoped that the library on campus will provide adequate syntax books so that future researchers can find references without having to look elsewhere or even from the internet.
