CHAPTER 1

INTRODUCTION

A. Background of The Research

"Transformer (2007)" is the first in the Transformers film series that tells the story of the feud between two super-sophisticated robots from outer space. Transformers belongs to the category of action, adventure and science fiction films (Action, Adventure, Sci-Fi). This work is headed by director Michael Bay with several main actors namely Shia Labeouf, Megan Fox, and also Josh Duhamel. To note, this form-shifting robot film was produced by Hasbro Studios, Paramount, Amblin Entertainment. Since its release in 2007, this film has had several follow-up series which were also quite successful in capturing the hearts of the fans.

Transformers begins when a teenager named Sam Witwicky buys his first car, which he doesn't know, is actually an alien robot incarnation. It wasn't the only alien to arrive on Earth. Optimus Prime and his fellow robot transformers have arrived in search of the AllSpark. But arch nemesis Megatron and the rest of the Deceptions have also come looking for the

AllSpark, and they'll do anything to get it, even if it means destroying the world. Transformers received mixed reviews from critics and positive responses from audiences. The film won four awards from the Visual Effects Society and was nominated for three Academy Awards, for Best Sound Editing, Best Sound Mixing, and Best Visual Effects. Shia LaBeouf's performance was praised by Empire, and Cullen's reprisal of Optimus Prime from the 1980s television series was well received by fans.

Sam Witwicky, played by Shia Labeouf, gets special attention from the writer because his character, which at first glance looks very chaotic, indicates a psychological disorder called Agitation in Sam. Which influenced Sam to become someone with a tendency to be angry, anxiety, and irritated. Moreover, in some scenes, Sam's actions are seen between conscious and unconscious. Sam himself is described as a young man who accidentally has to get caught in a war conflict between 2 Robot factions from Cybertron, the Autobots and the Decepticons. Through events that turn his new car into a Robot, Sam realizes that the fate of the earth is at stake. The writer is also interested in examining Sam Witwicky's behavior because the main character in this film is full of intrigue regarding the dilemma of which action to take. In examining Sam Witwicky's behavior, the writer uses Psychoanalysis Theory by Sigmund Freud. Freud argued that the subconscious is the source of the motivations and drives that exist in humans. Psychoanalysis includes three psychological elements, namely, *Id*, Ego and Superego. These three personality systems are interrelated with one

another and form the totality and human behavior which is nothing but the interaction of the three.

Through the problems above, the writer is interested in discussing them through this thesis entitled PSYCHOLOGICAL ANALYSIS OF SAM WITWICKY IN THE FILM "TRANSFORMERS" BY MICHAEL BAY.
