## **CHAPTER V**

## **CONCLUSION AND SUGGESTION**

In this chapter, the writer infers the answers of the research questions that correlate with the data analysis that is in the previous chapter of this thesis. Moreover, there are some suggestions that the writer gives for the reader as per the details below.

## A. Conclusion

As the analysis result, the writer inferred that the research is having an aim to find the type of derivational morphemes and the morphological process of each data that has been analyzed. From this research, the writer inferred several conclusions, as details below:

- 1. The data are taken from the *Bookstore Sisters* short story by Alice Hoffman, as the New York Time bestselling author. This short story was published in 2023. The short story has 12 word that contain prefixes and 48 word that contain suffixes. The data objects of the research are derivational morphemes. Those morphemes are taken from prefixes and suffixes. The writer possesses 60 data, those data object are from one short story title, means the *Bookstore Sisters* short story, the data objects will be noted its pages and lines from the short story source.
- 2. As the result of the data above, the writer found that there are two types of derivational morphemes, that are prefixes and suffixes, the suffix –ly is the most dominant of type of derivational morphemes that emerge with 43.3%

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from the data that the writer has been analyzed. It followed in the second rank which is prefix un- with 13.3%, then suffix -full and -ly with 5%, then prefix Re-, suffix -ment, -able, -y, -full with a percentage of 3.3% and in the last position is prefix Dis-, Im-, suffix-al -ly, and ish with a percentage of 1.7%. However, in total, it is still the suffix that is found the most in the data analyzed by the author, namely 80% suffix and 20% prefix.

3. The morphological process that the writer found in this research consists of 60 data, consisting of 26 data adjective to adverb with the percentage is 43.3%, , 7 data verb to noun with the percentage is 11.6%, however the writer also found if the suffix –er with the percentage 1.7% is not any changing that is still a noun. Moreover, 4 data noun to adjective with the percentage is 11.6%. There are 4 data noun to adjective to adverb with the percentage 6.7%. Next, there are 3 data Un- and Re- as verb to be still a noun with the percentage 5%. Then, there is 1 data –er as noun to be still a noun with the percentage 1.7%. As the analysis result it is inferred that there is a morphological process that has change the meaning and change the word class, however there is also a data that only change the meaning.

## **B.** Suggestion

In this research, the writer has some suggestions for several domains. Firstly, for college students, finding the derivational morphemes will enrich the vocabulary of their life and also be an abbreviation to do good speaking and writing in life. Moreover, it is suggested this research will give a better understanding of the derivational morphemes that can be adapted especially to certain situations. In addition, the writer wishes that this research could be referenced to conduct similar research.

The second is for the linguistic field, find and research derivational morphemes in a reading, one of which is a short story that is suggested to give a reference for further research in the future. In addition, clarifying the type of derivational morphemes is also important to determine to make it clearer in classifying the derivational morphemes as prefixes or suffixes.

The third as being last but not least, for society in general, it is thoughtful if the derivational morphemes and morphological process are only will understand by people who have a specified interest, especially in morphology. However, there is another that is chosen based on what makes them interested, something like a short story. In this way, the person that read such a short story that has some derivational morphemes there will easily understand the meaning of the context and the problem will be solved by own self. Therefore, the writer suggests learning to get a lot of new vocabulary by reading something that contains derivational morphemes.

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
