CHAPTER V

CONCLUSION AND SUGESTION

A. Conclusion

After assessing data from Meghan Trainor's Takin' It Back album, it was discovered that figurative language does provide special effects to beautify and add to the intensity of meaning in order to express particular messages in the lyrics. The songwriter is commonly used figurative language in the lyrics of these songs. The result is found Takin' It Back album contains 30 figurative language elements in 6 songs. This is the point:

- The writer discovered 5 of the 7 types of hyperbole in Meghan Trainor's song lyrics. They are as follows: 2 phrasal hyperbole, 11 clausal hyperbole, 5 single word hyperbole, 5 repetition hyperbole, and 2 comparison hyperbole. Furthermore, the result was discovered 1 personification of prosopographia. The last result is found 4 Implicit Metaphor in the song lyrics.
- 2. Based on the meaning aspect, it was discovered that songwriters frequently utilize figurative language to express a variety of utterances that would be unsuitable if conveyed in ordinary English. The writer also appears to exaggerate parts of the song words in order to make them more understandable and to beautify the lyrics. Meanwhile, the writer deduce the meaning of the figurative forms mentioned above from the meaning inherent in common language. The writer comes to this conclusion after

speaking with others and learning more about what the songwriter's figurative forms truly represent.

Based on the observations and research, each form in the song lyrics has its own significance. When compared to other types of figurative language, the lyrics of this song contain a wide range of hyperbole. This style appears to be the primary mechanism for expressing message through lyrics.

When analyzing this research, the writers discovered both advantages and disadvantages. The writer advantages of understanding the meaning and varieties of figurative language, particularly forms of metaphor, personification, and hyperbole in song lyrics. The author's disadvantage is that it is difficult to locate literature on the forms and distinctions of metaphor, personification, and hyperbole in English. As a result, the writer spent a significant amount of time studying this research.

B. Suggestion

Figurative language demonstrates the importance of diction in contributing to both music and singers worldwide. Music can lift a person's spirits. It is utilized in coffee shops to create a relaxing ambience. It is also employed in theater and dance to generate a sense of beauty. It is crucial in education, psychology, and commercial advertising. The shape and style may differ depending on the songwriter's education and experience, but music is essentially universal because it is easily accepted by many people in various areas or around the world.

The writer would like to make a suggestion:

1. For the Writer

There are still several flaws in both theory and analysis for the writers of this study. The writer, on the other hand, expects that this research will assist readers better understand figurative language, particularly metaphor, personification, and hyperbole. To be able to distinguish the forms of metaphor, personification, and hyperbole, we must first understand the branch of knowledge of figurative language, and then learn from books that explore metaphor, personification, and hyperbole in greater depth.

2. For the Reader

Readers should read a lot of works on figurative language, metaphor, personification, and hyperbole to deepen their understanding of the forms and meanings of metaphor, personification, and hyperbole. The author proposes that readers learn more about figurative language so that this research can be completed properly.

3. For the Next Researcher

The writer suggests to next researcher who want to analyze figurative language to decide which figurative topics to explore ahead of time. Next researchers can study multiple references from relevant expert to decide the data object to be investigated. Extend conversations with others and assist lecturers who are specialists in that topic.
